about THE OAFB

The Ontario Association of Food Banks is the province's leading provider of emergency food support to front-line hunger relief agencies and the leader in province-wide hunger research. Our mission is to strengthen communities by providing food banks with food, resources, and solutions that address both short and long-term food insecurity.

Every month, the OAFB food bank network provides food and support to more than 335,000 adults, seniors and children facing hunger. Through 128 direct member food banks, and over 1,100 affiliates, inclusive of breakfast clubs, school meal programs, community food centres, and emergency shelters, the OAFB provides over 6 million pounds of fresh and non-perishable food to those who need it most. For every \$1 donated the OAFB can provide three meals to someone in need.

The OAFB is not government funded and relies exclusively on the generosity of caring individuals and organizations to support and achieve its vision of a hunger-free Ontario.

The OAFB is a proud member of Food Banks Canada.

This report will detail how you are helping us fuel a brighter future by building food security, providing dignity and hope, investing in health and well-being, and reducing poverty.

On behalf of the Ontario food bank network and the people we serve, thank you to our partners and future partners for your support. None of this work would be possible without the continued commitment of passionate, caring individuals like you!

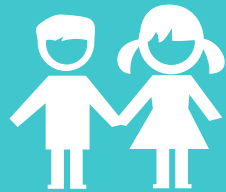

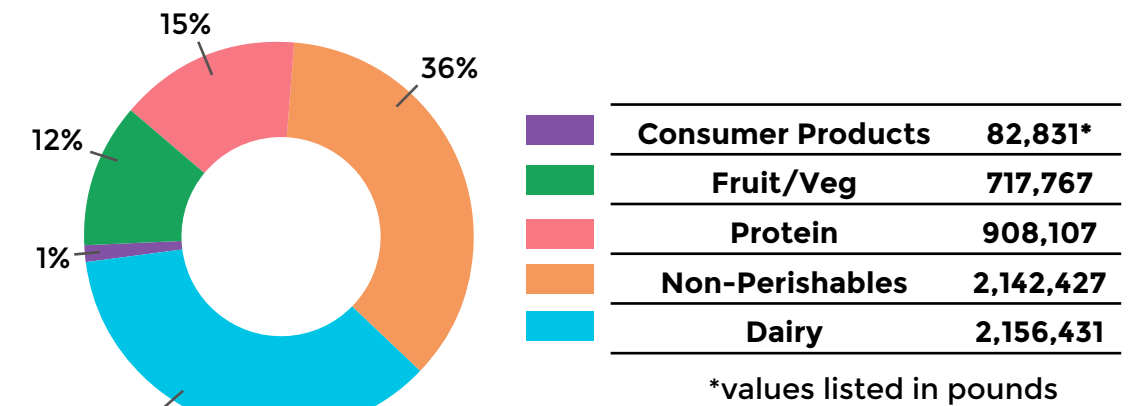
YOU'RE INCREASING *food security*

At the very heart of our organization you will find our fresh food programs. Last year, 335,000 Ontarians received vital food each month when they accessed a food bank supported by the OAFB.

Because of you, we distributed the equivalent of 5 million meals to our network in 2016-17; that's 1 million more meals than last year!

Providing healthy meals and balanced hampers is key to a brighter future. When an individual is able to stop worrying about where their next meal is coming from, they can begin to focus on finding a new job, improving their employment skills, or doing well in school.

YOU'RE MOVING *5 million* MEALS

Getting healthy food to 335,000 people in need every month is no small feat! The OAFB's FeedON distribution network ensures the safe and efficient delivery of food into the hands of those who need it most. This network relies on the collective cooperation of our member food banks, food partners and transporters, and Food Banks Canada.

HOW DO WE FEEDON?

1. DONATE

A donation of food is made to the OAFB by one of our many partners: farmers, the food industry, and producer groups.

3. TRANSPORT

We contact our transportation partners with details of the delivery, and they ensure the donated food arrives safely at its destination, which could be any of our 128 food banks across the province.

5. SHARE

The donation is shared with people in need through the hard work of dedicated staff and volunteers at our member food banks and affiliate agencies.

2. COORDINATE

We send notice of food offers to our members via SNAP (Smarter Needs Allocation Program), a program designed for us by IBM. Food banks make requests on offers, and it is allocated on an equitable basis.

4. RECEIVE

Our food banks receive their donated food - whether it be through our direct delivery points, at the local food bank's loading dock, or in partnership with local businesses who receive shipments on their behalf.

As a young adult attending school, I found it very difficult to make ends meet financially. With my disability, I found it impossible to seek employment to supplement my income.

Thankfully, my practicum was at the local food bank. I was able to use their services guilt-free, and experience what it was like to be a client. This greatly increased my ability to relate to the client base, and understand what they would have to undergo just to be fed.

On the other hand, I was able to observe and assist through my practicum as a college student in ways that I otherwise thought didn't exist. There is so much more to the concept of food banking than just feeding the public.

I've watched as volunteers meticulously sorted the food product, all the while smiling

and forming their own sense of community with each other. I've also spoken to many clients, ever-willing to tell their story as to why they needed to use food bank services.

Through smiles and tears, I've learned to quote "everyone needs at some point". Where one may need a lawyer for a once in a lifetime occurrence, another may need an electrician. Just as much, we need to eat.

Even deeper, I've experienced the sense of community through the food bank as we partner with many community supports. Each month, we assist other facilities so they in kind may assist clients who have a greater need for food, thereby forming a dietary "safety net" so no one will be left hungry.

I've decided to pursue outreach in my community, and help make sure that no one is left behind. The tight-knit community supports that the food bank has shown me gives me a greater hope for success and change.

I also found out that they help kids with doing activities. My daughter always wanted to do horseback riding. With the help from Pelham Cares she was able to do that. Every year my daughter was also able to go back to dance with their help.

One year they recommended my daughter Tamara to go to Tim Hortons Camp. I was so grateful for this. Tamara had the time of her life there. Because of Pelham Cares Tim Hortons Camp asked Tamara to go to a youth leadership program. Tamara is so excited to go. This will be the

first time she will be going on a plane.

Pelham Cares is so wonderful, friendly, and caring. I still, after 5 years, cannot believe all they do for Tamara and myself. They help with Christmas presents for Tamara. I am so grateful for that because I cannot afford to buy her presents. She would be so disappointed if she woke up Christmas morning and there was nothing under the tree. They help with Easter and Thanksgiving.

It's just amazing. I cannot express how grateful I am for them. I could never repay everything they have done. They deserve an award for the best place to go. I have cried sometimes for all they do.

Without them we would not be able to eat sometimes and Tamara would never be able to do the activities she does. Again I am so very grateful and thankful for them. I look so forward to going there - not just for the food they give, but to see them.

They always seem happy to see me and if I want to sit down and talk with them, they always make time for me. They are wonderful, kind and awesome people. Thank you for letting me express my story about them.

YOU'RE INVESTING IN *nutrition*

Our food bank network is working hard every day to ensure that their neighbours have the nutrition that they need to not only survive, but thrive.

In 2016, we continued to invest in healthy futures through exclusive grants to our food bank network. These funds were directed towards child nutrition programs in rural areas and increasing fresh food capacity at local food banks.

We also launched the *Feeding Fresh! Sysco Community Garden Grant*. The community garden projects funded through this grant will be a source of fresh, healthy food for people in need in the community.

RURAL KIDS IN ACTION

House of Lazarus in Mountain (population: 11,095) partnered with the Dundas Youth Centre to provide after school cooking classes with weekly meals. The program involved youth directly in meal preparation, including food literacy and food safety – such as how to use a vegetable peeler and a knife, measure ingredients, wash fruits and vegetables, and meat handling.

Since implementing the program the Dundas Youth Centre has seen an increase in after school program attendance. Youth participants are eager to learn and improve their cooking skills, and are looking forward to creating a cookbook with their favourite recipes.

YOU'RE JOINING THE FIGHT AGAINST *poverty*

We are the provincial voice for hunger. Now, more than ever, leadership is needed on this issue. Together with our partners we continue to bring greater awareness and support to short and long-term solutions for hunger in Ontario.

In June, we held our annual conference in Thunder Bay. The conference provided the opportunity for our dedicated leaders across the network to come together, learn, connect and share ideas about tackling hunger in their communities.

In September, the OAFB launched our first Hunger Action Month. The month-long campaign, aimed at raising awareness of the issue of hunger in Ontario, included the national Food Banks Canada initiative Hunger Awareness Week, a province-wide MPP sort, and a Day of Action at Queen's Park.

SHINING A SPOTLIGHT ON ENERGY POVERTY

Research on the state of hunger and poverty in Ontario continues to be a priority for the OAFB.

Our 2016 Hunger Report put a spotlight on energy poverty and precarious employment in Ontario, and made recommendations for tackling the root causes of poverty. It generated an estimated 55 million media impressions and was widely quoted in the provincial legislature.

The Hunger Report continues to be a tool for legislators and media who are looking to tell the story of hunger in Ontario.

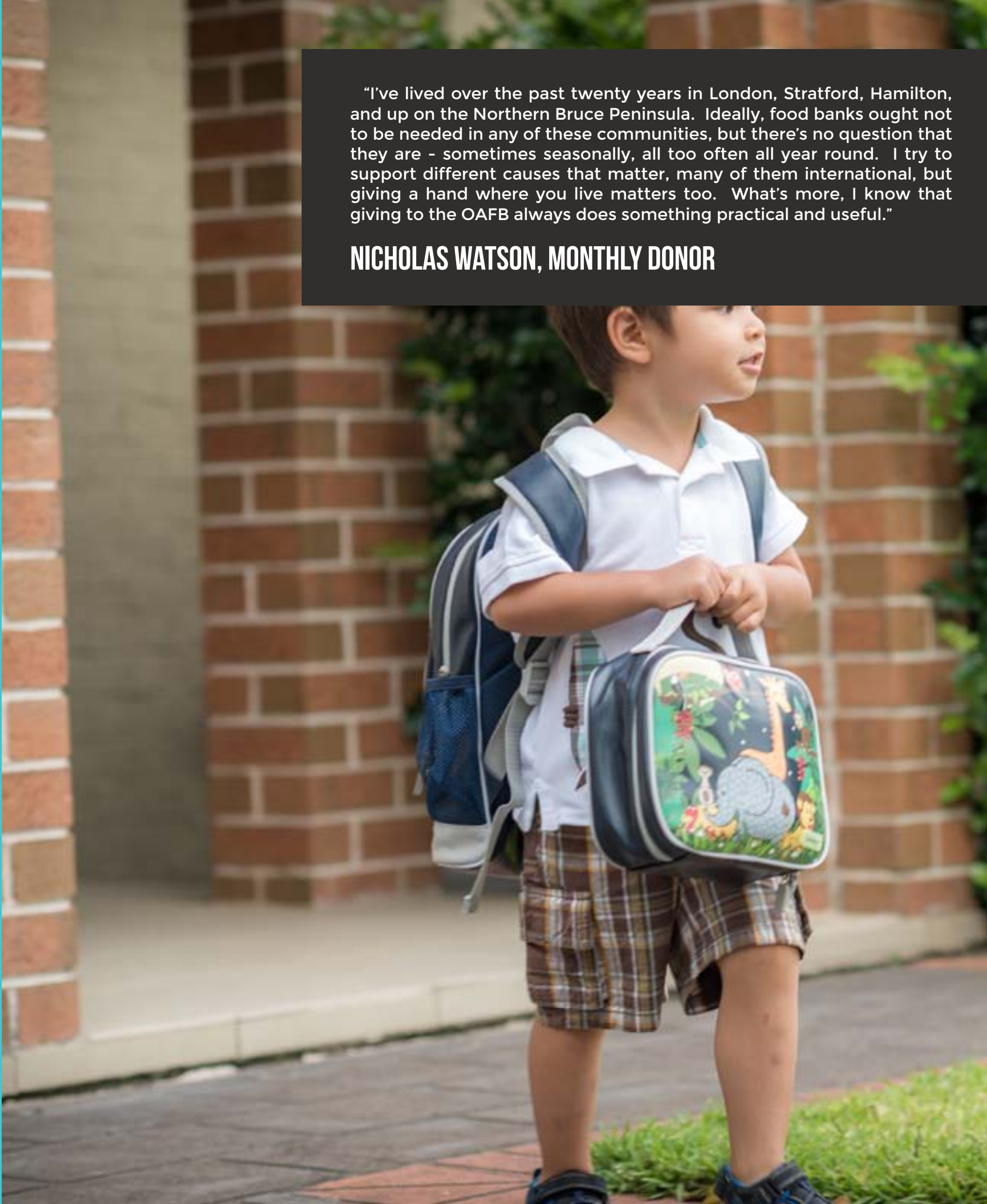
